
## DOMAIN: TIME ALLOCATION WORKLOAD DISTRIBUTION ON PAID AND UNPAID WORK AMONG WOMEN AND MEN IN AGRICULTURAL SECTOR


## **DEFINITIONS:**


- Activities included in paid work: On-farm work, Off-farm work, Products sale
- Activities included in unpaid work: Housework, Care for children and elderly members of the household
- According the methodology, individuals are considered as disempowered in the domain "time allocation workload" if work more than 10.5 hours per day in the previous 24 hours (Alkaire, 2013).

## **KEY FINDINGS:**

- · Women in agricultural sector have a larger workload than men.
- On average, women work 11.06 hours per day while men work 9.68 working hours per day.
- Men have mainly paid work, whereas almost half of women's work is unpaid (41,7% of the total workload belongs to unpaid work).
